
And chances are that it's something different for everyone in the family.

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quad bikes, Little Sahara, wildlife and raptor parks, historic lighthouses, Seal Bay and everything from unique Ligurian honey producers to eucalyptus and lavender farms. (A tip for when the fish aren't biting... the Island boasts not only some fine wineries but also some great microbrewers and distillers.)

But don't think fishing is just something for dads: one of the best family experiences you can have is with Sean and Vicky of Emu Bay Fishing Charters. Even if you don't want to try your hand at landing snook, whiting, trevalley and even tuna, there's no better way to enjoy the pristine waters and spectacular northern coast of Kangaroo Island than a trip offshore in a 10-metre boat. Charters are for 4-12 people and resume in September (see https:// www.emubayfishingcharters.com.au for full details). A stint of fishing with the children on the jetty can also bring a haul of sweet mullet. (Let us know if you want to know about the 'secret' and almost foolproof bait to use.)

You will, of course, want to cook your own fresh fish, but Emu Bay is only 15 minutes from the great range of bakeries, pizzerias, restaurants, cafes and pub at Kingscote, all of which can help get you out of the kitchen and into island pleasures. We'd especially welcome you at Amadio Wines' KI Cellar Door & Restaurant.

Seaside Emu Bay remains the Island's premier holiday, investment and residential development and we'd love you to come see us and take some time to find out all that KI has to offer.
